PRK What To Expect During Treatment Day

PROCEDURE

- · Wear comfortable clothing. All make-up should be removed.
- Please arrange for a driver to transport you to and from LasikPlus on the day of your treatment.
- Contact lenses must be removed prior to treatment as follows:
 - · Hard lenses: at least 3 weeks
 - Gas Permeable Rigid lenses: at least 3 weeks
 - · Soft lenses: as directed by your doctor
- Prior to your treatment, you will receive drops to prevent discomfort during the procedure.
- The non-operative eye may be patched or taped closed to better align your other eye for treatment.
- It will take a few minutes to properly position you under the microscope.

- You will be asked to focus on a flashing light throughout the procedure. Your doctor will monitor your eye through the microscope at all times.
- There will be two parts to your treatment. First, the doctor
 will prepare the surface of your eye. Then you will hear a
 vacuum-like sound accompanied by a metallic tapping as
 the laser gently alters the refractive curvature of your eye.
- The actual laser treatment takes between 15 and 60 seconds.
- Afterwards, the doctor may apply a soft contact lens to serve as a bandage to help your eyes heal.
- It will be best to rest for a few hours after your treatment.
- A cold-pack placed gently over the eyes may be used to ease any discomfort.

POST-TREATMENT

- Wear comfortable clothing. All make-up should be removed.
 Over the next week, use the eye drops as prescribed.
 Remember, drops start 2-4 hours after your treatment

 (as directed by your doctor). You will receive written instructions immediately following your treatment.

 These drops are very important to ensure proper healing.
- Do not to rub or squeeze your eye(s); this may knock the bandage contact lens out of your eye. If the bandage contact lens does fall out of your eye DO NOT try to put it back in — Call LasikPlus Vision Center immediately.
- You may experience the following sensations after your surgery:

Burning — This usually occurs within 12 to 48 hours. It may feel like sand in your eye(s). You will be given some medication to take to keep you comfortable.

Watering/Tearing — Your eye(s) will probably water, or tear, for the first couple of days. Remember not to rub your eye(s) — just dab gently.

Red/Swollen Eyes — Your eye(s) may be slightly red and swollen during the first 48 hours. This is perfectly normal.

Blurriness —Your vision may be blurry for the first 48 to 72 hours and will gradually clear. You may notice a significant improvement by the end of the first week.

Ghosting/Glaring — During the first few weeks, your vision may fluctuate slightly or you may experience some ghosting or glare. This is normal and will improve.

Light Sensitivity – You may experience increased sensitivity to light for the first few days after treatment. A good pair of sunglasses will help.

Sometimes the doctors will choose to perform the PRK
procedure on one eye at a time and treat the second eye
on a later date after the first eye has healed significantly.
If you wear glasses, you may want to remove the lens on
the operative side. If you are a contact lens wearer,
you may wear your contact lens in your untreated eye.
